Rearmament	Supplying a country with new weapons to become a strong military power
Appeasement	Giving in to the demands of an opponent to prevent further disagreement
Home Front	Actions of the public who stay in a country and work to support the war effort whilst that country's soldiers are fighting in another country
Front line	Where fighting takes place during a war
Blitz	The period of intense bombing by Germany on British cities between September 1940 and May 1941
Atomic bomb	A highly destructive bomb that uses a nuclear reaction to create an explosion
Cold War	Conflict between USA and USSR that did not involve any direct military attack on the other, but both feared the other and so tension between
Democracy	Government is chosen by an election where the people have the power to vote an decide on who should govern and the laws that should be followed.
Dictatorship	Where one leader has all the power and makes all the rules and decisions with no elections, control of the people is often through terror
Communism	Where all land, property and resources are owned by the people and controlled by the state. Each person is paid and works according to their needs and abilities.
Capitalism	Where land, property and resources are owned by private individuals who compet to make a profit which is unequally shared between owners and workers.
